Governor's Emergency Order

Late last night Governor's Whitmer signed Executive Order 2020-39 which includes 10 provisions that directly impact EMS in the State of Michigan. Some of the highlights are that the order includes allows for adjusted ambulance staffing, temporary suspension of agency inspections unless there is a complaint, allowances for downgrading of ambulances based on staffing availability, and an extension of 6 months to all expiring EMS licensure and CPR certifications past the end of the emergency declaration. EMS Drug bag Cassette Decontamination

The latest recommendation from the hospital Infection Control is to consider all EMS cassettes entering the facility *as contaminated*. The updated procedure for cassette exchange will be:

- 1. Use cleaning supplies provided by the hospital.
- 2. Wipe down the outside of the drug bag cassette and all of the contents inside the cassette prior to exchanging at the receiving facility.
- 3. If you set down the cassette inside the hospital the EMS provider will wipe down the location(s).
- 4. Pharmacies will be putting items which cannot be easily cleaned into plastic baggies which can be wiped down.

Limited sanitizing supplies

Region 6 Medical Coordination Center has a limited supply of sanitary wipes and hand sanitizer available on a first requested, first served basis to interested partners between the hours of 10AM and 5PM until exhausted. The hand sanitizer is available in ½ gallon quantities (bring your own container).

<u>Telehealth</u>

The latest. During the Regional EMS agency, provider and MCA conference call the participants were updated on the current progress of implementing telemedicine in response to COVID-19. At this time each MCA has agreed that in the region e-Bridge will be used as the video conferencing piece and EMTrack as the notification piece of the process. From there each MCA is working both within their jurisdicution and regionally to assess the best way to roll it and more importantly when it will be rolled out in their area. 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Meter Dose Inhalers (MDI's)

Just a general reminder for all EMS providers to bring the patient's MDI's with them to the hospital.

<u>PPE – change to surgical mask usage</u>

There is no change to yesterday's message of encouraging EMS personnel don at least a surgical mask while on duty, responding to calls, and in public to continue to reduce potential exposures to our first responder community. However, we want to make sure that we were sending a consistent message. We should all be in "*Extreme Conservation Mode*" when using PPE. Below are links to both the State of Michigan and the CDC's guidance documents.

By following these guidance documents, or your agency's guidance, it allows for multiple reuse of PPE by the EMS providers as long as they do not become soiled or torn.

It is also still suggested that all patients have a surgical mask placed over their mouth and nose as soon as reasonably possible to further prevent the chance of exposures. This change is also being rolled out at several of our hospitals throughout the region where the expectation that <u>all</u> patients will have a surgical mask in place prior to entering the facility.

We are working to increase the availability of all PPE, especially surgical masks with this change, for all responders. **Follow your local MCA guidance.**
